Fish leather was used for items such as shoes, pouches, as well as for decorations. Our Indigenous Cultural Programmer, Nicole, will lead this workshop on making your very own fish leather wallet. Nicole is a member of the Squamish Nation and practices a variety of traditional indigenous material crafts.
