Tuyúsalanexw Kenny Nahanee opens the 26th annual North Shore Writers Festival with a traditional welcome to the territory.

Tuyúsalanexw Kenny Nahanee is a Squamish Elder, father, grandfather, and great-grandfather. Born and raised in the Lower Mainland, he did his schooling on the North Shore. His knowledge of Coast Salish culture was limited for the first 35 years of his life, but he has learned much more in the past few decades. Also known as “Chief,” Tuyúsalanexw has been a member of the Squamish Seafaring Canoe Family since 2000 and has emceed many Elder dinners.
