The writers will be celebrated at an Awards Ceremony in mid-October. All contest participants will have the opportunity to read from their stories at the event.

Participants will be celebrated at an awards gala at City Library on Oct. 19, and will have the opportunity to read from their stories. All winners will have their stories professionally bound and printed and receive a copy to keep. Copies will also be added to the collections at City Library and North Vancouver District Public Library!

## **Guidelines & info**

Genre: This year we will be accepting short stories on the theme: Butterfly Effect.

Content: Incorporate the theme: Butterfly Effect. Be creative with the prompt. It can involve cause and

effect; little things having big impact; change and metamorphosis - or any ideas that this theme

Format: Submissions must be submitted in one of the following formats: .doc, .docx, .pdf, .rtf, .txt. Please use standard margins, 12-point font, and double spacing. Do not title your story *Butterfly Effect* or *Writing Contest*. Do not include your name or other identifying information on the document. This will be included on the submission form only.

Judging: Entries will be read by a panel of local authors, teens on the organizing committee and librarians. Submissions will be judged on the following elements: incorporation of the theme, development of plot and characters, structure, creativity, and mechanics (spelling, grammar, etc.). Five winners will be selected and there will be an audience choice awarded at the ceremony in October from among those authors who attend and read from their stories.

Submissions: Only 1 entry per applicant will be considered. The submission should be an original short story written by you in 2025.

Participation requirements: The contest is open to anyone going into grades 7 – 12 who live or go to school on the North Shore.
