Learn about Coast Salish art with Squamish Nation artist Aaron Nelson-Moody, or "Splash". Splash's ancestral names are Tawx'sin Yexwulla and Poolx'tun. His expansive career is composed of carving, graphic design and metalwork. Splash is also an educator, who works to research, preserve, and rekindle Coast Salish art and culture.
